2021 Foundation Stage Baseline

- Establishing the stage of every pupil on entry to primary school
- Providing a starting point for ongoing progress tracking, allowing teaching and learning to be tailored accordingly
- All aspects of the assessment's development have been informed by an extensive evidence base of early years research
- Gives a progress measure for the school and gives schools credit for the important work they do in the first 3 years of a child's education

Timetable from September

- Daily phonics lesson with a new sound taught each day
- Child Initiated time for topic based work –
 opportunities for indoor and outdoor learning
- Maths lessons daily with adult led groups and some independent activities
- Fine motor skills daily
- Story time daily
- PE once a week
- RE once a week

How we teach in the EYFS

- Topic based learning i.e. fairytales, teddy bears, space, people who help us
- Each week is based around a book
- We read the book each day
- Children have a choice of challenges that they can complete around each book.
- These topics are often child led.

What a fabulous start to school. My daughter is so proud of learning her sounds and making a start to be able to read.

The home visit enabled us to get to know our girl's teacher and TA, but also time for my child to bond some more. It was a good forum for all those last minute questions or worries.

We have found RWI really supportive in their development of sounds and their their development of sounds and their reading. They are able to mimic the actions and speak at home when they actions and speak at home when they play schools!

We found the transition from Nursery to Year R really effective. We liked the fact that our child was seen in their setting and the opportunity to talk to key workers. We also really liked the transition days spread over the Term 6 – this gave them great confidence and familiarity with the school and the environment.

I am extremely pleased with the way that my daughter has settled into Year R. She is very happy and loves coming to school, which, as a parent, is the most important thing.
