- Off curriculum Friday The children will have the afternoon to choose activities that will support their mental health. This could be sport, art, music or just talking with peers. All activities will be supported by staff.

## Safer Internet Day 2022 – Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February - 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'

The School Council spoke about how the Internet, and being online, can be hard and sometimes upsetting. We looked at the theme for this year and thought that it was really important to cover this in a fun way but so that the message was clear.

- Launch video explaining the purpose and idea behind 'Safer Internet Day' from the UK safer Internet centre
- Class chosen activities that explore how we can be safe when online and respectful when gaming. These
  could include designing an avatar, reviewing the safety of certain website/platforms, writing Twitter
  messages or designing items using software.
- Each class is to join with another class to play charades on a platform. This is to encourage the respect and fun aspect when playing against others.
