Message from Mr Witts, Executive Headteacher

Welcome Back!

This has been a week of very mixed emotions.

It has be such a privilege to welcome back our children and families to school. It is always lovely to see the children excited to return at the beginning of term.

School staff have been helping the children settle into new classrooms and new routines. The Early Years team have been working extremely hard preparing themselves and the environment for our New Year R children next week. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the staff for getting our school ready and set to welcome children back this year. Our school is looking and feeling fantastic!

This excitement and optimism has been contrasted in the past 24 hours by the very sad news of the death of our Queen, Queen Elizabeth II.

We have celebrated her life, her service and dedication to our country today.

As we process and reflect upon the death of the Queen, we may find we are reminded of those close to us whom we have lost. It is important to give ourselves the time to remember what we loved about them, why they were special to us, and acknowledge the sadness of losing them. We are happy to support anyone who is finding this difficult.

As a school we set high expectations. Over the summer the Government and the Children's Commissioner set out new expectations for attendance in school, with all children being expected to have 100% attendance in school. No holiday will be authorised, unless the most special of circumstances. Even illness and medical appointments have a large impact on children's learning.
