Our first term together seems to have passed by so quickly. Thank you for all your support of the school; as parent experts in your children, we cannot do our job without you. It has been wonderful to see how quickly the children have settled into their new classes and new teaching teams; I never cease to be amazed by their enthusiasm to show me their work and learning. 
