Laurenden Cottage, Church Lane - Large well-established garden surrounding an early 15th century cottage. Largely shrubs and seasonal underplanting backed by climbers and natural hedgerows. Kindly opened by Amanda. Serving hot/cold drinks and homemade cakes.

Brambles, Church Lane - A plantsman's garden with the emphasis on wildlife. Evolved over 25 years through natural self-seeding and includes, a small woodland, vegetable garden and wildflower areas. Kindly opened by Janet & Ron.

Fallowdene, Church Lane - Large yet secluded wildlife friendly garden, full of interesting plants. Divided up into areas on different levels providing varied vistas and views. Hedges provide shelter for foraging insects. Kindly opened by Brenda.

Church End, Church Lane - Large garden with impressive topiary and closely dipped box hedges. A classic English country style with naturalised woodland. Surrounded by mature trees providing idyllic setting in which to relax. Kindly opened by Mia & Mark.

Shooters Moon, The Lees - An 'Artists Garden' with mixed borders, shrubs, climbers and containerised plants which can be moved around the garden. Often, an inspiration for John's paintings, which will be on show (weather permitting). Kindly opened by Pat & John.

Wisteria Cottage, Cleveden Court - A small, secluded garden which you enter through a brick archway, but packed with interesting colourful planting, a mature Acer tree, water feature and rockery. The mature wisterias at the front make a strong statement. Kindly opened by Margaret & Peter.

Grouse Cottage, Orchard Lane – Newly established garden, intensively planted with colourful herbaceous borders, shrubs, roses and climbers. Includes a wildlife area with naturalised bulbs, ponds, vegetable plot and an espalier mixed fruit tree hedge. Kindly opened by Angie & Mike.

Oak House, Paddock View — A small creative garden, contoured to provide a number of different areas, including herbaceous borders and a private collection of over 300 cacti and succulents. Kindly opened by Jayne & Richard. Serving hot/cold drinks and hamemade cakes.
