# Ready, Respect, Safe

Following our School Behaviour rules of Ready, Respect, Safe. May we politely ask that parents/carers remind children to demonstrate respect in and around the school site including on the field. Our families and children represent our school in the wider community and would ask that we all follow our school Values of Compassion and Community at all times.

We kindly ask parents to follow the below guidelines to ensure infection or illness are not passed on to other children. Our policies are put in place to protect everyone within school.

Please keep your child off school:

Vomiting or diarrhoea – for at least 48 hours after the last episode.

Chickenpox – until the last batch of spots have crusted.

Measles – for 5 days from the onset of the rash.

**Mumps** – for 5 days from the onset of swollen glands.

Impetigo – until the lesions have crusted over.
