Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday we celebrated Safer Internet Day. We started the day with a whole school assembly led by the Digital Ambassadors, and they did a fabulous job. This day is a chance to think about any worries we might have about using technology and the internet, but it's also about celebrating all the fantastic things technology can help us with. Each class did different activities throughout the day to look at how they can be safe online.



Year 5 discussed how technology has changed over the past 30 years and the impact that it has had, both positive and negative, on the world we live in today. We studied persuasive design techniques and the effect they create on the user. We decided that although new technology is overall a positive change, we recognise the dangers that we face because of it. We know that in order to keep safe we must follow some simple steps:

- Don't chat to people you don't know.
- Don't accept friend requests unless you know them personally.
- Don't share personal information
- If something pops up that you don't like, report it and then block it.
- If something pops up online, don't click on it as you don't know where it might send you.
- Use a random profile picture and username and protect your passwords.
