World Book Day



On Thursday, Gary Parsons visited school to talk about how to illustrate books. We learnt that rubbers are important! Rubbers help us to draw. Our drawings don't have to be perfect; we can change and edit them.

Thumbnail sketches use rectangles to create the pages of the story and space is left for the words of the writer. We stretch our imagination and elaborate what we know about a character, using previous images we have seen. The children were in awe of Gary's drawings and were amazed by the illustrations he created based on one of the children. Once it is complete, and the publisher has decided they like it, it's time to add colour. Gary uses a very tiny brush to paint the detail.

Children were then able to draw themselves by stretching their own imagination and think about a book cover they would send in to a publisher.
