Please try and read with your child on a daily basis, reading is the key to accessing the rest of the curriculum. Your child will need their reading log and reading book in school each day, even if you haven't read at home so that

we can read with them in school. Books will be changed on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday.



The children have recently been assessed in RWI and continue to be taught in small groups according to their phonic knowledge; this means that we can work on the next steps specific to your child. By the end of this term, we would expect most children to be at Red level, begin to learn their Set 2 sounds and be able to independently blend to read words.



This term, in RE, the children will be learning about religious stories and holy books from different faiths. Children will be looking at some Jewish, Hindu and Islamic symbols and what they represent.



In PSHE, the children will be learning about different jobs and friendships. We will be discussing the jobs of people in their families, how to make friends, resolve disagreements and how to show respect and be a good friend.



Our topic this term is 'People Who Help Us'. We will read a different book each week and our child-initiated work will be based around this book. We are excited to welcome a police officer, a doctor and a veterinary nurse to school

to talk about their jobs and have a bus come to visit the children to enhance their learning.
