
A message from Miss Moore, Senco and Assistant Headteacher

What a week it has been! Thank you all for your patience and support during the past week.

It has been incredibly busy and challenging week, but the process was very fair and professional.

Many of you may be wondering when the report will be published.

As per paragraphs 168-170 of the Ofsted School Inspection Handbook; the report will be sent to school within 18 working days. The school will then have 5 days to respond and the final report will normally be published within 30 working days of the inspection. We will share this with you at this point.




2K Stem Exhibition


