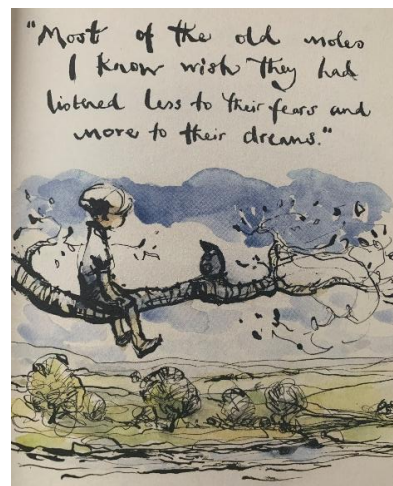

No Outsiders Day

Next Wednesday, we will be welcoming Andrew Moffat from No Outsiders in to school.

Andrew is a very experienced trainer in schools and will be sharing with our staff and children how to use the No Outsider approach across Kingsnorth CEP School.

No Outsiders teaches children they belong in school. We say there are "No Outsiders" here because everyone is welcome; we talk about being different and playing together.

Andrew will teach a different, age-appropriate lesson using a different picture book in each year group. The lessons are usually for half an hour and will be part of the normal school day.

'At No Outsiders we have always believed that sharing resources with parents is key; we want parents to know the picture books we use and to have access to the assemblies we publish every week. In this way we can make sure our messages of belonging and inclusion are aligned. We all want the same thing, which is for our children to feel safe and happy in school and beyond.'

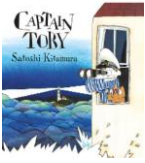

Weekly Book Recommendations



KS1 - Captain Toby by Satoshi Kitamura - *When Toby can't sleep due to the wind, rain and thunder outside, he finds himself and his home transported into the ocean where a giant octopus lurks. This is a wonderful book with sparkling and imaginative artwork and memorable characters.*

KS2 - The Wonder Brothers by Frank Cottrell Boyce. *When Blackpool Tower disappears, Nathan and Buddy begin a roller-coaster quest to bring it back. Travelling to Las Vegas, they encounter the legendary magician Perplexion in the gripping, funny and well plotted chapter book that explores magic, illusion and the unexpected.*



KS2 - Wild by Ele Fountain. *Jack is out of control, getting into trouble at school and pushing boundaries. He thinks his mum doesn't notice until she invited him to join her on a surprise work trip, unexpectedly adventuring deep into the rainforest where real danger exists around every corner. Covering themes of gang peer pressure, loss of a parent and attention seeking behaviour and bravado.*
