Due to Term 6 being extremely busy we have made the decision to pause Ice Pole Friday. Hot Chocolate Friday will return in September

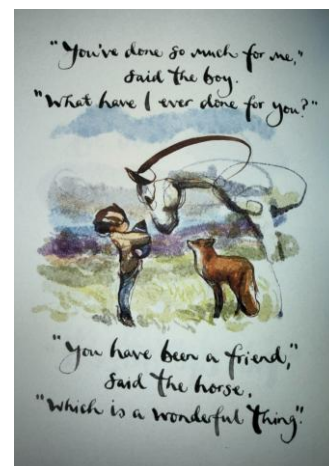

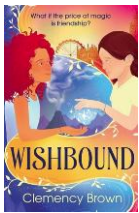
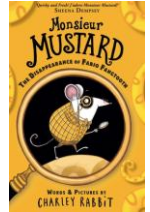
# Reading for Pleasure

## Weekly Book Recommendations



**KS1 - The Mole and the Mound by Will Hamilton-Davies.** *The mole is digging hard. But Bird, Beaver and Bee aren't impressed. They have built excellent homes too - a nest, a lodge and a hive. Until a storm comes along... should they take up Mole's kind offer of a shelter in the mound? This is a warm hug of a story. The text is rhythmic and rhyming, making it a delight of a read.*

**KS2 - Monsieur Mustard by Charley Rabbit.** *Monsieur Mustard, the pint sized detective has just returned to his home city of Bath and is hungry for a new mystery. So when Fabio Fangtooth disappears from his restaurant, Monsieur Mustard leaps into action. What follows is a whirlwind adventure filled with clues, red herrings, funny animal characters, action and more twists than even the twirliest of moustaches can the detective crack the case before it's too late?*



**KS2 - Wishbound by Clemency Brown.** *Leonie Braugen can make wishes come true - which might sound like a pretty wonderful gift. However, the reality is that it's a valuable commodity and everyone born with this ability on the Island of Onske is torn from their families and transported to the sinister Wishmaker Institute. This is a captivating adventure story, impeccably paced and bursting with magic.*

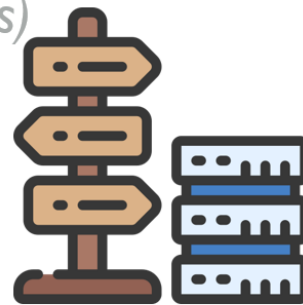
