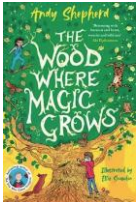
Thank you for your support in helping us keep our school a safe and focused place to learn.

## Weekly Book Recommendations



**KS1 - The Wood Where Magic Grows by Andy Shepherd.** Iggy and his brother Cal stumble upon Wildtop Wood, a mysterious, overgrown forest at the end of their garden. As they explore, they hear whispers of dying magi and meet creatures leading them to a hidden secret. Full of adventure, friendship and bravery.

**KS2 - The Land of Roar by Jenny McLachlan.** When Arthur's grandad disappears, Arthur searches the attic, thinking it's a trick. But soon he realises that he's slipped through a folding bed and into the Land of Roar. This wonderfully imaginative and immersive fantasy story will draw in and grip 8-9 year olds with a perfect blend of magic, mythical creatures, adventurous heroism and unbreakable friendships.



**KS2 - The Day My School Got Famous by Jen Carney.** When Ferris's foster brother Nile moves in, home life gets louder and more complicated. Things escalate when an unexploded Second World War bomb closes their school, leaving the family stuck together for weeks. Ferris tries to keep drawing his cartoons while dealing with worry, disruption and change. Told through fun comic strips, the lively story explores fostering, empathy and how families adjust when life does not follow a neat plan.

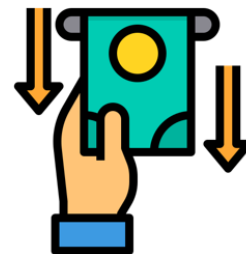
