A massive congratulations to **3G** and **5T**, who consistently won their respective tournaments, demonstrating outstanding work ethic, determination, and perseverance throughout the year.

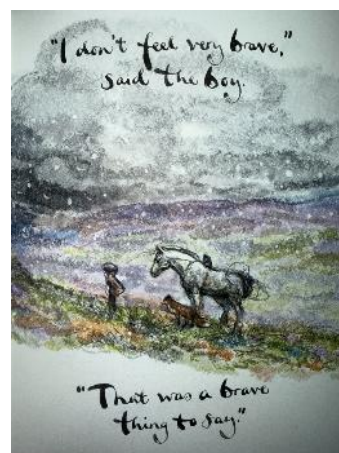

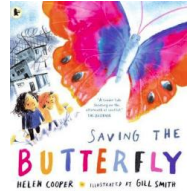
Reading for Pleasure

Weekly Book Recommendations



KS1 - Luna Grace Girl from Outer Space, by Julie Sykes. Luna and her friends travel to Puffin Island with Twizzle the moon cat. While her parents study wildlife such as dolphins, gulls, wildflowers and puffins, Luna spends the day looking for a mermaid. The fast paced, fun story follows their seaside trip, the family's routines, and what Luna spots along the way.

KS1 - Saving the Butterfly by Helen Cooper. Two siblings find refuge in a new country after being rescued at sea. The younger brother quickly embraces their new life, but their sister is haunted by fear and memories of what they left behind. When he brings home a butterfly, she slowly learns to open up and let go. This book explores the journey from trauma to hope through the eyes of children rebuilding their lives after conflict.



KS2 - Chicken Hill by Beccy Blake. Ferdy, Gripper the pug and Tink the cat team up to investigate the strange goings-on in their town, including frog empires, zombie cactuses, and the odd alien or two. This trio of stories is packed with talking animals, quirky inventions, and plenty of unexpected twists. With fast pace and chaotic humour, Chicken Hill is a winning pick for children who love fun cartoon-style adventures and chaotic comedy.
