LEAVING SAFELY

- Try to always have a mobile phone on you, but if you don't have a mobile, find somewhere you can quickly and safely use the phone should you need to.
- Consider opening a separate bank account in your own name.
- Consider buying a separate SIM card for your mobile phone.
- Have some money saved in case you need to use a taxi or a bus.
- Consider having a packed bag ready away from the house, somewhere safe i.e. neighbour, friend you can trust.
- Take important documents such as your marriage and birth certificate, any court orders, passport, benefit and bank books and health records.
- Take toys for children along with comforters, nappies, dummies etc.
- Take a list of phone numbers for emergencies, including friends, relatives and local police
- Take sentimental personal possessions i.e. photos, jewellery
- If you have pets and are worried they may not be looked after if left behind, try to arrange for someone to care for them
- ONLY leave if it is safe to do so
- Tell someone you trust that you are safe

Domestic Abuse is not just physical, it can also include emotional, sexual, financial and verbal abuse. It keeps you isolated and afraid and makes you feel trapped and powerless.

Domestic Abuse can happen to anyone regardless of gender, sexuality and between adult family members.

Your partner may:

- Stop you having friends
- Not let you out alone
- Time you and question your movements
- Accuse you of having affairs
- Control what you wear, who you see or contact and what money you have
- Stop you seeing your family and prevent you from responding to your children in a way that you would like to
- Call you names, belittle you, make you feel bad about yourself or make you think you are crazy push, punch, bite, kick or strangle you

Domestic abuse is not just affecting you, for children it can:

- Create emotional turmoil
- Make children aggressive or withdrawn disrupt education
- Prevent them from bringing friends home create fear
- Cause bed-wetting
- Cause physical injury (they get caught in the cross-fire)
- · Have long-term consequences
